
## Results - Year 12

**Progression Exams:** 

Please be aware that if a student posts a U-grade (i.e. a 'fail') in any of their Year 12 Progression Exam subjects, we will need to speak with parents and students. This meeting usually takes place in the last week of term – w/c July 15. It is an important part of any progression process for entry in to Year 13 so please do be ready to make yourself available should it prove necessary.

## **External Exams:**

Several students will have sat external, formal examinations or completed NEA-based qualifications (e.g. EPQ). Please be aware that the results of these will be available in September on our return to NLS for 2024-25.
