

## Year 12 Curriculum Overview

**Rationale:** 

The KS5 curriculum is designed to build on the skills developed in KS4, the focus now is developing a personal style of work. Pupils are taught a number of decoration and construction techniques in a range of workshops at the beginning of the course. A few months in to the course pupils will complete a baseline project from a selection of set tasks. After the base line project pupils will start their Non Exam Assessment (NEA -Component 1) which is worth 60% of their A Level. For Component 1 pupils can choose any topic they wish to study.

Sketchbooks are a personal choice and can be bought from Amazon, WHS, Rymans, Paperchase. Recommendation is no smaller than A4 in size.</li> <li>Set up a Pinterest account if not already and complete search related to theme.</li> <li>Pupils in Y12 spend should spend 3 hours a week on homework.
