# Year 9 French Curriculum Overview

Rationale for year group & skills: French students will undertake 3 lessons per fortnight. They will study the topics of festivals and celebrations, free time and house and daily routine.

Autumn Term	Knowledge: Students will learn about some of the key festivals in French-speaking countries including Le Carnaval, La fête de la musique and Le Nouvel An. Students will learn about various aspects of these festivals including the history and the customs and traditions in different Francophone countries. Students will recap regular —er verbs in the present tense and will also learn regular —ir and —re verbs. Students will revise food items and use the partitive article to ask for food in a market scenario. The future tense will be revisited and students will be confident using it in questions and answers. At the end of the module, students will confidently use the present and near future tense together.	Skills for Assessment Speaking and reading  Assessment The speaking tasks test the ability to provide answers in whole sentences, even if they are short, asking and answering questions to put together a conversation leading to more detailed answers: providing opinions and reasons, qualifiers, connectives, adjectives, negatives, time phrases, comparatives, superlatives as well as referring to present and past tenses.  The reading tasks test the understanding of single words, of familiar vocabulary, short extracts	Revise twice or three times per week in 10-15 minute slots to be able to remember words.  How to revise:  a. Look, cover, write / say aloud, check method. b. Get somebody at home to test you and check your answers. c. Make flashcards and test yourself - English on one side / French on the back.

#### Skills:

Students will be able to listen and respond to longer passages as well as reinforce dictation skills. They will learn strategies on how to have longer spoken conversations and deal with the unexpected. Students will read for gist, using clues and look for positive and negative expressions. They will also practise expressive writing on the festival and celebrations topic as well as reinforce translation skills not only from French into English but also from English into French.

#### Wider experiences:

Students will gain a wider understanding of the culture and traditions in French-speaking countries and be able to compare it to their own experiences.

will learn how to form questions using a range of interrogatives to ask others how they use digital technology and to invite a friend to the cinema. Students will also learn a variety of negative constructions and use them with present tense verbs. Towards the end of the topic, students will recap the perfect (past) tense and use it confidently with the near future tense to talk about free time.

#### **Skills:**

Students will be able to identify false friends and distractors in both listening and reading. They will reinforce their listening skills and respond to longer texts, developing note-taking skills. Students will also learn to use sound-writing links and predict pronunciation. They will speaking confidently and reinforce key phonic sound patterns. Students will develop reading comprehension skills by using context, pictures and prior knowledge. They will write creatively.

## Wider experiences:

In this topic, students will appreciate how young people's perception of free time activities varies across the Francophone world, with particular focus on French-speaking countries in Africa. Students will learn that in countries like Cameroon, many young people own a mobile phone, but in the Democratic Republic of Congo, internet access is very limited and therefore young people must fill
