



## Year 9 Curriculum Overview – New York Urban Fashion Design

**Rationale:** The Year 9 curriculum is designed to build on skills taught in Y7/8. Students will look at the work of Keith Haring and Jean-Michel Basquiat and refer to the Urban New York backdrop. Pupils will analyse and form opinions on their work. They will develop practical skills taught in Y7/8 such as hand embroidery, applique and use of the sewing machine. They will also be introduced to silk screen printing and repeat pattern design that will enable them to produce their own tote bag or scarf.
