As we progress through a busy term at North Leamington School, we wanted to provide you with some important updates and information on upcoming events.

### Careers: Year 11 Mock Interviews Tuesday 26 November

We are delighted that we have been able to secure a number of external interviewers from a range of local businesses and providers to support running Year 11 Mock Interviews.

The event will take place on Tuesday 26 November and will be an opportunity for us to provide all Year 11 students with the experience of an interview and to receive feedback from it.

Students have been told that they are attending an interview for a generic job.

They spent some time last year creating a CV/personal statement in tutor time and we are encouraging them to update this and to print off a copy to bring to their interview so that they can receive feedback on that from the interviewer as well. We have set a G4S homework to this effect with a template that they can use.

To set the scene it has been a topic during our assembly and students have completed a tutor session on:

- How to prepare for an interview
- The key elements to secure a positive interview
- The questions that they will be asked

Students received a copy of the interview questions this week and the questions have also been added to the G4S homework.

Each student will have a 10-15 minute interview allocated to them during the day. The way they present themselves is a key part of the interviewing process so we suggest students wear their school uniform. Alternatively they may wear smart business-like clothes if they have them; it is not expected to purchase new items of clothing for this interview. For the boys this should be a smart shirt, trousers and shoes; for the girls a smart blouse or shirt, a skirt or trousers and appropriate shoes.

We want to ensure that all students have a positive experience, whilst presenting the best image of our students to our external interviewers and appreciate any support parents and carers can provide for their child during this process.

# Year 11 GCSE Mock Exams – December

The first stage of mock examinations, to prepare our students for the summer exams, went extremely well in October. We are really proud of the way our students prepared for these and conducted


















themselves each day. The results of these mock examinations are now on G4S and can be accessed by parents/carers.

We believe by giving students multiple opportunities to get used to the exam environment, this will inevitably support them in the long term, to help reduce levels of worry and anxiety. Familiarity in location and expectation is really important for success to happen next summer.

We are now preparing students for the next window of mock examinations, which is the biggest window of almost ten days. These will take place in the final two weeks of this half term. The timetable below has been shared with students three weeks in advance, so they have significant time to get ready and prepared. When students do **not** have an exam, they will be attending normal lessons and using this time productively with retrieval and revision at the heart of these sessions, whichever subject is being delivered.

In the above window of exams, there are no Maths papers. Maths will be part of the February series with all three exam papers scheduled in the timetable. Combined Science students will also be examined in February.

Students will receive a personalised timetable with seat numbers and rooms on shortly before the exam weeks. Students should report to the canteen in advance of the exam time, with the exception of Art, Photography and Textiles where they should go straight to the classroom at the start of period 1 or 4. Students need to ensure they are familiar with the examination rules that they have heard in assemblies, including wearing their full uniform and having their own correct equipment, including:

- Clear pencil case for equipment such as pens, pencils, calculator (where permitted)
- Water bottle with a sip lid only

Also please recall, the following JCQ regulations, of what is not allowed-

- No mobile phones
- No watches
- No calculator cases
- No writing on hands
- No glasses with AI technology built in

Once an assessment is complete and students are dismissed, then students should return to their normal timetabled lessons or morning break. Where an exam finishes during break time, please report to the canteen for an extended break time.

Results from these Mock Examinations will be shared with students on during a special assembly in January, in the same style as an August results day.

It goes without saying that we are entering a very busy period and collectively, by working together, we are convinced we can make this period of time as enjoyable and rewarding as possible.

We will be offering after school revision sessions and a timetable with the subject details will be sent nearer the time and will also be available on the website so everyone is aware what subjects are on offer. This will start on Monday 3 February, each night after school from 3.20-4pm, and run until exams commence. All subjects will be offering support to our students at this crucial time. Please encourage your child to attend as many as possible
