# Happy New Year!

As we move into a new term, I would like to take this opportunity to revisit our World Class Basics of uniform and punctuality.

## **Tutor Time Themes for this Term**

We will also take part in activities during Children's Mental Health Week, where we will be reminding students of the importance of looking after their wellbeing and signposting and reminding students of mental health support available both at NLS and externally through recommended agencies.

In addition, we will highlight National Apprenticeships Week, showcasing alternative pathways to success after school. Students will gain insights into the variety of opportunities available, helping them think ahead to their futures.

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# **Starting the GCSE Options Process**
