Dear Parent/Carer,

Year 11 have had a fantastic return to school this week. Standards of students' uniform has been excellent so thank you to all parents and carers for their support with this. The Year 11s also displayed a fantastic attitude in their first assembly of the year, led by Mr Lowdell, where the focus was on being the best versions of ourselves. We also celebrated the achievements of last year, particularly the GCSE RE results. We are so proud and of particular note is that 97% of students achieved or exceeded their target grade. The specifics are as follows:

These are truly remarkable outcomes and demonstrates that students are rewarded for their consistent efforts. Personal and academic success has been proven to be underpinned by students demonstrating world class basics. Excellent uniform, attendance and punctuality will continue to be a key focus this year as students prepare for their GCSE exams next summer so that students have the best opportunity to make positive progress in their lessons at school.

- Their subject curricula where subject teachers have shared information and real-life stories of a range of careers and routes to those careers that link to their subject.
